
SASSUOLO: MY TOWN

Number 1: DUKE FRANCESCO 1ST D'ESTE



Francesco was duke of Modena and Sassuolo from 1629 to 1658.


It is thanks to him that the old castle was transformed in the palace that you can adimire today.

Number 2: MY WIFE, CLELIA FARNESE





Via Clelia in our town center is dedicated to her.

While I spent lot of my time fighting in battles, my wife was governing the town.

Clelia was a very assertive ruler, she decided that whovere would swear should be punished with a fine of ten golden scudi, he was also supposed to be tied up for an hour to the column of the Palace of Reason in Sassuolo with his tongue tight in a vise, a real torture!

She banned several games, including the *ruzzola* whether the wheel was made of wood or of parmisan cheese. This game was banned when the stakes overcame 48 bolognini in valuequando il valore della posta in gioco. Clelia was a very beautiful woman, she was born in Rome where she was considered the most beautiful woman of that period.



NUMBER 3 : ELEONORA BENTIVOGLIO



She was my incesto. In 1486 she married Giberto Pio, Lord of Carpi. Two years before the wedding he was nominated Captain of Bologna by his father Giovanni II Bentivoglio.

Later Gilberto became the Lord of Sassuolo, but he died before reaching town. Eleonora ruled in his place from 1501 al 1505. Her son Alessandro was infact too young to govern Sassuolo

Her nickname is "The Fairs lady" because in May 24°, 1503 she was granted permission by Alfonso I d'Este to organize a commercial fair free of any custom duties. Custom duties back them were real obstacles to the exchange of goods.

DURING THE FOUR/FIVE WEEK-ENDS OF OCTOBER THESE HISTORIC TRADE FAIRS ARE STILL ORGANIZED IN OUR TOWN NOWADAY.



NUMBER 4: COUNTESS LEONTINE



Our youngster library is located in this villa surrounded by a beautiful park. This villa belonged to countess Leontine, and belonged to her family for several generations. The library is dedicated to the countess.




NUMBER 4 : SCULPTOR GRAZIOSI
